

Instructions for Contributors

Text files should be in RTF, PDF or Microsoft Word format (2.5 cm space on all margins, 1.5 lines spacing, Times, font size 12 pt). Figures and tables should be provided as separate files, and should not be embedded within the text of the manuscript (except in PDF files, where they may be included on separate pages). Figures should be in PDF, TIF, JPG or BMP format. Upon initial submission, figures should be in low resolution only. After final acceptance of the manuscript, figures must be submitted as originals to DGHT or as electronic files with a minimum width of 131 mm at 300 dpi resolution.

Major articles should include title, author(s), detailed abstract, key words, introduction, materials and methods, results, discussion, acknowledgements and references. Authors' addresses must appear subsequent to references. Provide figure captions on a separate sheet. All scientific genus and species names must be in italics. Use Small Capitals for authors cited in text and in references. Do not use capital letters in any part of the text. Do not use any text format except italics, bold and Small Capitals. Do not use syllabification. Only literature cited within the text should be included in references. Multiple publications by an author or a team of authors within the same year should be indicated by a, b, c and so forth. For style and the correct format of citations, please refer to a current issue of SALAMANDRA.

Shorter contributions are also accepted and should include title, author(s), brief abstract, key words, text, acknowledgements and references. Generally, the text of shorter contributions should follow the structure of major articles; however, do not include headings with the exception of acknowledgements and references.

Taxonomic works must follow the current "International Code of Zoological Nomenclature". Descriptions of new species/subspecies must include at least preserved holotype, collection number, exact locality, detailed description of holotype and a diagnosis (the diagnosis should compare the new species/subspecies with all closely related taxa). Include measurements, as appropriate for the respective taxonomic group, of the holotype and include photographs or detailed drawings of same specimen. Contributions based on the permanent removal of specimens from the wild should indicate the localities, collections and catalogue numbers of voucher specimens. The numbers of requisite permits and licenses must be mentioned in the acknowledgements. Molecular data submitted for publication to SALAMANDRA must be deposited at a recognised archive, such as the National Institute of Health's GenBank (National Center for Biotechnology Information, NCBI, USA). Representative voucher specimens must be placed in scientific collections. Accession numbers for molecular sequences and voucher specimens should be provided in the manuscript.

Authorship implies responsibility. All authors must have played a significant role in designing and performing the study and/or in writing the manuscript. Those whose efforts were limited solely to providing materials and financial support or commenting on the manuscript, should be recognised in acknowledgements. Honorary authorship must be avoided.

The editors will examine a given manuscript upon submission. If appropriate, the manuscript will then be reviewed by two external reviewers. Acceptance will be based upon the quality of the science. If both reviewers recommend rejection of the manuscript, the editors do not have the option to accept it.
